

11. The application asks for the state(s) I have been licensed in and asks for the basis of licensure. What does that mean? What if I'm licensed in more than one state? Do you need verification from all states I have ever held a license in?

In the basis of licensure box on the application, you need to indicate whether you became licensed in that state by Exam or by Endorsement.

We need verification from all states where you have ever held a license (active or inactive). This is to ensure there have not had any disciplinary actions or suspensions and to ensure that your current license is in good standing.

12. There have been changes to the Public Health Code and Administrative Rules that require licensees and individuals seeking licensure to complete human trafficking training. When does this take effect?

Beginning with the January 2017 renewal cycle, and all renewal cycles thereafter, licensees must have completed training in identifying victims of human trafficking that meet the standards established in Administrative Rule 338.1303.

Beginning March 17, 2021, individuals seeking licensure must have completed human trafficking training prior to obtaining a license as an MD.

Licensees, or individuals seeking licensure, must complete training in identifying victims of human trafficking only one time. The department may select and audit a sample of individuals and request documentation of proof of completion of training.
