<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Hand off transfer report/form • PICC, Central Line, Midline dressing changes • Blood draws • Blood glucose testing • Wound VAC care • ICP monitoring • Peritoneal Dialysis • Hemodynamic monitoring • Nasogastric tube insertion • Urethral Catheter Insertion* • Tracheostomy Care* 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Blood Transfusion (may monitor for reactions w/faculty or preceptor) • Pleural Drainage device care • Plastic Surgery dressing changes • First post-op dressing changes • Administer chemotherapeutic agents (including oral medications) • Care for patients with airborne precautions • IV Push Medication Administration* • Central Line access or medication administration • Students ARE NOT to be assigned to patients with airborne precautions, receiving chemotherapy, or on a BIPAP. <p style="margin-top: 10px;">*May be performed by SENIOR PRECEPTED students directly supervised by a Beaumont RN.</p>
