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- The clinical instructor is to supervise all aspects of students' patient care & medication administration.
- CHE staff RNs are not permitted to supervise and/or cosign on medication administration.
- CHE staff RNs may allow students to observe them as they provide patient care as part of their training.
- Patient permission must be obtained prior to the student assignment or performance of procedure.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Discuss with Charge Nurse:               <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Time patient care begins &amp; ends</li> <li>- Medication Administration times</li> </ul> </li> <li>▪ Determine Student's Patient Assignment</li> <li>▪ Obtain patient permission to work with students.</li> <li>▪ Review and Co-Sign Documentation.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Obtain report from RN at beginning of shift; report off prior to leaving floor and end of shift.</li> <li>▪ Complete patient care, report to assigned RN.</li> <li>▪ Complete documentation with Instructors co-signature.</li> </ul>

### **Cohort Students & Faculty MAY Perform** (not limited to)

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Patient bath/oral care/hygiene</li> <li>▪ Skin Assessment</li> <li>▪ Vital Signs</li> <li>▪ Monitor/Record: Intake/Output</li> <li>▪ Patient positioning</li> <li>▪ Peripheral IV Insertion</li> <li>▪ Peripheral IV Removal</li> <li>▪ Peripheral IV Dressing Changes</li> <li>▪ Saline IV flush</li> <li>▪ Empty/measure JP &amp; Hemovac drains</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Assist with patient feeding</li> <li>▪ Perform Oral Suctioning</li> <li>▪ Patient Transfer/Ambulation</li> <li>▪ Medication Administration (with exception of Chemotherapeutic agents, IV Push Medication Administration and Critical Care/ Progressive Care Only Medication Administration)</li> <li>▪ Perform Simple Wound Care</li> <li>▪ Straight urethral catheterization</li> </ul>
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### **Cohort Students & Faculty MAY NOT be Permitted to Perform**

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Hand off transfer report.</li> <li>▪ PICC, Central Line, or Midline dressing changes.</li> <li>▪ Access any device used for dialysis</li> <li>▪ Insertion of nasogastric or orogastric tubes of any kind.</li> <li>▪ Insertion of indwelling urethral catheters.</li> <li>▪ Make decisions about implementation of patient restraints or seclusion.</li> <li>▪ Obtain Patient consent.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Administer blood products or participate in any of the process of administering blood products.</li> <li>▪ Administer level 1 agents via any administration route.</li> <li>▪ Care for patients with airborne precautions.</li> <li>▪ Administer IV Push (IVP) medications</li> <li>▪ Perform any type of blood draws. This includes peripheral or central line blood draws.</li> <li>▪ Initiate access to a central line.</li> </ul>
