Program Structure

The PGY-1/PGY-2 HSPA-L residency is designed to develop knowledge, skills, and abilities needed for success in health-system pharmacy administration. The two-year HSPA-L residency strives to meet the needs of the resident based on candidate interests, and individual goals alongside a combination of required monthly and concurrent longitudinal rotations to provide a robust training program. Residents will have the opportunity to function as valued members of health care teams and will build leadership experience utilizing knowledge and experience gained in operations and clinical services.

Upon completion of the program, residents will have developed the clinical acumen, business knowledge, and professional skills required to become an effective pharmacy leader in any health care organization. The first year is designed to provide a strong clinical foundation with a variety of clinical and non-patient care learning experiences. The second year builds upon the success of the first and provides exposure to managers and leaders in the department in financial, medication safety, operational, and clinical management experiences. Graduates of the program will receive a PGY-1 Pharmacy Residency certificate and a PGY-2 Health-System Pharmacy Administration and Leadership Residency certificate.
